## FROM THE CEO

Firstly, I would like to introduce myself, I am Andrew Campbell and along with my wife Tammy have relocated to Northampton from Manjimup to take up the role of CEO with the Shire of Northampton. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank everyone so far for welcoming us to the multiple communities in the Shire district since I commenced on 22 May 2023.

By way of background, I am a qualified Environmental Health Officer who quickly transitioned into management roles in Local Government working my way through to the position of CEO in 2014. Having spent seventeen years as a senior executive in Local Government I have been able to develop specific skill sets, knowledge, and experience that I will be applying to the CEO role at the Shire of Northampton.

I have been very impressed generally with the Shire district particularly the resilience of people after the cyclone. I understand the recovery impact on communities from a natural disaster having presided over a major bush fire event in 2015. I am aware of the damage to significant public infrastructure from the cyclone and give my commitment to expediting public infrastructure repairs. As this happens, please be mindful that there is a complex process to gain approval under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) and that process is very constrained by the requirement to replace infrastructure "like" for "like". The Shire has recently engaged consultants GHD to assist and rapid progress is being made already. Further community information will be released about the repairs in the coming months.

Aside from my focus on the cyclone repairs, over the next period I will be spending my time understanding the Shire organisation and business improvement required, making introductions with the business and "not for profit" community, re-establishing connections with government, and generally acquainting myself with the Shire district. Whilst I am predominantly located in the Northampton Shire office, I also intend to be based in the Kalbarri Shire office at least three days per fortnight to improve accessibility to the CEO.
