## 9.9 TOWN PLANNING REPORT

Mrs Katherine Jackson, Acting Principal Planner declared an interest in item 6.3.1 – Proposed Event – Northampton Dirt Drags, Sandy Gully as her brother is an event organiser.

9.9.1 PROPOSED EVENT - NORTHAMPTON DIRT DRAGS, SANDY GULLY (ITEM 6.3.1)

Moved Cr STOCK-STANDEN, seconded Cr GLIDDON

That Council:

- A) Grant Planning Approval for a special event (dirt drag racing) to be held on Lot 17 Bowes River Road, Sandy Gully subject to the following conditions:
- 1. This approval is valid from 7:00am Saturday 5 November, 2011 to midnight Saturday 5 November, 2011 with public camping only allowable overnight on Saturday 5 November, 2011;
- 2. No dogs are permitted on the site during the event;
- 3. A first-aid facility or St. Johns Ambulance and fire fighting facility shall be provided at the event site and attended by suitably qualified person(s) at all times during the event;
- 4. Firebreaks are to be provided to the satisfaction of the local government;
- 5. n emergency vehicle access road to be constructed and maintained to allow for two-wheel drive access;
- 6. Rubbish bins are to be provided around the event site and removal/cleanup of rubbish shall be undertaken during and immediately upon the conclusion of the event to the satisfaction of the local government;
- 7. The supply and sale of alcohol in association with the event is NOT permitted unless appropriate licences have been obtained, with the local government to be provided with a copy of such licence(s);



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- 8. The event shall NOT proceed unless appropriate public liability insurance has been obtained, with the local government to be provided with a copy of such liability insurance for competitors and spectators;
- 9. Portable chemical toilets (or other approved effluent disposal systems) shall be provided at the camping area, the main spectator area and the pit area in accordance with health requirements to the satisfaction of the local government;
- 10. All car parking areas (spectator, competitor and officials) and camping areas shall be clearly signposted and delineated to the satisfaction of the local government;
- No camping is permitted within 30m of the nearest definable bank of the Bowes River;
- 12. The drag racing strip to be delineated and provided with suitable safety barriers to prevent public access;
- Suitable traffic management measures being undertaken at the intersection of Bowes River Road and Horrocks Road to the satisfaction of the local government;
- 14. Suitable dust control measures being undertaken to the satisfaction of the local government; and
- 15. Any signage not within the event site is subject to further approval by the local government.

## Advice Notes

- i. Any permanent buildings proposed on-site require building licence approval(s);
- ii. The Applicant should further liaise with Council's building/environmental health officer and the local police;
- iii. In granting this approval it should not be construed that further annual approvals will be granted, and in determining further applications the local government will take into consideration the level of management of the event and any complaints received regarding the event; and
- iv. The Police Act 1892 states:

# 42. <u>Police may enter places of public entertainment and remove certain</u> <u>people</u>

Any officer or constable of the Police Force may enter into any house, room, premises, or place where any public table, board, or ground is kept for playing billiards, bagatelle, bowls, fives, rackets, quoits, skittles, or ninepins, or any game of the like kind, when and so often as any such member shall think proper; and may enter into any house, room, or place kept or used in the said State for any theatrical or any public entertainments, or exhibitions, or for any show of any kind whatsoever, whether admission thereto is obtained by payment of money or not, at any time when the same shall be open for the reception of persons resorting thereto and may remove from such house, room, or place any common prostitute, or reputed thief, or other loose, idle, or disorderly person who shall be found therein; and



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- v. In regard to Condition No. 7 above, the Applicant is required to obtain a Section 39 and 40 Certificate from the local government, and any other approvals as may be required by other Authorities.
- B) Grant delegated authority to the Chief Executive Officer to grant approval of this event in future years, subject to their being no complaint having been received concerning the running of the previous year's event.
- C) Should a complaint be received concerning the running of the previous year's event, or the Chief Executive Officer deem that an issue warrants additional consideration, applications for future approval of the event will not be dealt with under delegated authority and will be presented to Council for its consideration.

## 9.16 NEW ITEMS OF BUSINESS

### 9.16.1 CR SIMKIN – COMMING FIRE SEASON

Cr O Simkin advised that with the increased fuel loading within the district this year that it is necessary for all landowners/residents to be vigilant on their properties.



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It was requested that all Fire Control Officers and Captains be made aware to report inadequate fire breaks and help reduce fuel loading.

# 9.16.4 CR WILSON – KALBARRI TOURISM OPERATORS

Cr Wilson raised the following issue from a recent visit to Kalbarri in September 2011. The issue stems from the apparent lack of commitment by local tourism operators and the treatment from tourist based businesses to the travelling public. While this is not isolated to Kalbarri this was the view from a recent visit to Kalbarri.

While the individual complaints will not be highlighted here, they will be relayed to the Chief Executive Officer who can forward them, on Councils behalf.

The growing concern is for those tour operators and others who are not operating in a professional manner, and the good operators could be copping a penalty for those actions.

The Council currently provides good funding to the Kalbarri Visitors Centre on an annual basis.

These concerns are viewed by others, which should be addressed.

That Council correspond to the Kalbarri Visitor Centre, raising the concerns by visitors pertaining to the standard of services in several tourism based operations and request that these concerns be brought to the attention of their members and also the Kalbarri Visitor Centre and appropriate training be offered to local tourism operators to help rectify these issues.
