CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S MESSAGE

2025 is well and truly upon us and the Shire is looking forward to what it may bring. It certainly is looking like busy times for the Shire with a number of significant capital projects still to deliver from the 2024/25 budget including:

- Little Bay Road upgrade;
- Port Gregory carpark and foreshore upgrade;
- Finalisation of Coastal Infrastructure Repairs in Kalbarri (defects and final tidy up);
- Whiting Pool stairs;
- Port Gregory water supply;
- Stephen Street depot works; and
- Kalbarri-Ajana Road stage 2.

In addition to this the June 2024 flooding events across the Shire have caused significant damage to the Shire's road infrastructure. The event has been determined a natural disaster and the Shire is working with the consultants to quantify the damage to the State and Commonwealth Governments. This is expected to be a long process based on previous experience however the outcomes should be worth the significant effort required to obtain funding.

The Shire has a statutory obligation to undertake a significant review of its Strategic Community Plan every four years. This process commenced in late 2024 where an online survey was completed with 64 respondents. On February 12 and 13, 2025, the Shire along with consultant Steps and Co will be conducting Strategic Community Plan community workshops in towns in the Shire and I would encourage as many people to come along and participate.

The 2023/24 Annual Electors Meeting will be held at the Horrocks Community Centre at 5pm on Thursday 6 February 2025. If you would like to ask a question, please submit the question in writing to the Shire, 2 days before the meeting is held to enable an informed response to be provided.

Hopefully the community is starting to see the benefits of having dedicated Community Development Officers working for the Shire. Operating in a shared role out of both the Northampton and Kalbarri Shire offices, Andrea Teakle and Cresta Viellaris have hit the ground running with involvement in Community Grants, events and community consultation. It was fantastic to see the Shire supported screening of the film Runt in January with excellent numbers of families attending the free event.

The Coastal Infrastructure Repair in Kalbarri from TC Seroja has reached the Practical Completion point. Please be patient whilst defects and final tidy up occurs from the contractors. It is important for the community to understand that the Shire and its consultant have done what we can to obtain Disaster Recovery Funding in what has been a very complex and restrictive process. The rules only allow "like for like" basic replacement with some ability for coastal retreat of impacted infrastructure. As an example of the difficulty with the rules, revegetation within the project areas is not funded although it was certainly impacted by TC Seroja. The repair work also must comply with statutory requirements and Australian Standards. The Shire is acutely aware that further improvements will be required, however this will not commence until we accept handover from the contractors. The Shire also, where possible, intends to partner with local community groups to undertake further improvement.

KALBARRI FORESHORE MASTERPLAN PUBLIC CONSULTATION

After the announcement of \$8.1M in funding for the Kalbarri Foreshore Revitalisation Project (Masterplan), the Shire has been requested to deliver the project by the Mid West Development Commission (MWDC). The Masterplan was a collaboration between MWDC and Tourism WA following preliminary consultation with the Kalbarri community in October 2021, six months after TC Seroja. From that point the Masterplan was developed and certain elements of it were funded by the State Government.

In consideration of the request to deliver the project, the Shire has identified that whilst targeted consultation has occurred with some stakeholders, a thorough public consultation process has not occurred. As a result, the Shire has undertaken substantive public consultation with the community to guide project delivery and these responses will be considered by Council at the meeting to be held 20 February 2025.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY FREE MOVIE NIGHT RUNT

The recent Free Movie Night, sponsored by the Shire of Northampton, highlighted the importance of collective enjoyment and entertainment in bringing families and the community together. Last month, Community Development Officers Andrea Teakle and Cresta Viellaris set up pop-up information stalls to spotlight the much-anticipated Kalbarri Foreshore Revitalisation Works. The stalls drew crowds, demonstrating that our community is not only interested in development but also passionate about making their voices heard!

At the stalls, community members had the chance to engage directly with Shire representatives. It was

heartening to see locals sharing their ideas and feedback, contributing to the future of our town. RESIDENTIAL GLAZING REQUIREMENT

The National Construction Code and associated Australian Standards set down standards for appropriate glazing in certain circumstances. Areas where wind loading and human impact can occur need to comply with a safety standard to protect the occupants and infrastructure alike.

Recent wind events indicated that impact damage to glazing was the main cause to its failure, combined with water egress to the inside of the building resulted in a combination of further damage.

The failure of fixed glazing will allow wind pressure to enter the building and combined with the negative pressure (suction) on the exterior of the building can force the roof structure to fail. Glazing panels should have a stamp on the surface area indicating that the glass complies with AS 4055 but this may not always be the case.

Although Building Applications specify compliance with Australian Standards 4055, it is best to confirm with the glazier, via the builder, that this is the case. The glazier should be able to produce a "Certificate of Compliance" to indicate compliance with the appropriate standard. A non-conforming issue with the Australian Standards could give rise to the occupants safety and insurance claims in any future wind event.

DIVIDING FENCES IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

A standard dividing fence will not attract Planning or a Building Application, however, a variation needs to be looked at to satisfy street amenity and the structural integrity of the proposed variation.

A standard fence stands no more than 1.8m in high and recedes down to 1.2m maximum at the front boundary. The fence can be manufactured out of color bond, cellulose fibre, timber or masonry as standard products, other variations will require Planning/Building approval.

Unapproved variations may come under scrutiny by insurance companies during a wind event and become void due to being non-conforming with the manufacturer's specifications. Please also note that the Shire of Northampton is in a Wind Region B2 and certain construction requirements need to be adhered to.

LOW NUMBER DISTRICT PLATES

Low number District Plates are available at the Shire Office through the Department of Transport now. Numbers are random and guaranteed to be under NR1000. They are available on a first come first served basis with priority given to residing families.

If you are the proud owner of a District Plate did you know that if you had one of your plates missing or stolen you lose that number and new plates need to be reissued?

The Department of Transport has brought in a new system named Optional Plates. For a fee you will secure that special number to yourself and gives you flexible options where it can be sold, transferred, changed to trailer issue and can be reissued to you if one or both of your plates go missing.

Did you know you can have your number plates remade? If you have state or district plates you can have your plates remade and also have the option of three colours. Blue WA, black on white background or black on yellow background. Please see one of our friendly staff members for further enquiries.

Department of Transport services are available Tuesday to Friday 8:00am – 3:30pm.

EVENT APPROVALS

Events are defined as regular or one-off events where people assemble for civic, social, educational, entertainment, sporting, religious, business, or other purposes. Examples include concerts, shows, festivals, exhibitions, and similar events.

To hold a public event in the Shire you need to apply for approval. This process involves providing a range of documentation with your application including site plans, evidence of public liability insurance, comprehensive risk, and emergency management plans. You may also need to consider and provide documentation and plans for traffic management, first aid and emergency service access etc.

As there are a number of laws to comply with, the application that you need to submit will depend on the type of event you are planning. As a starting point, you should consider contacting the Shire's Community Development Officers.

RETIREMENT OF NORTHAMPTON REFUSE SUPERVISOR GRAHAM PATTERSON

Graeme Patterson resigned from his position as Northampton Refuse Site Supervisor on 16 December 2024. Graham joined the Shire of Northampton over 10 years ago and has provided a dedicated service to the Shire and Refuse Site users by coordinating the operations of the Landfill Transfer site in the town. In addition to his work for the Shire he has been an active volunteer for the local Bushfire Brigade. We enjoyed celebrating his retirement with him at the Shire's end of year function and wish him well in his future endeavours.

KALBARRI OPEN AIR CONCERT

Jamart Sound Lounge of Perth has applied and received approval for the Shire to hold the Kalbarri Open Air (KOA) 2-day music festival event again in 2025 on the Kalbarri Oval and will include the use of the Kalbarri Sport & Community Centre. The dates are Friday 4th & Saturday 5th April in the hope that the weather will not be too hot for musicians and attendees. There will again be a variety of music styles showcased from country music, pop-rock,

alternative/indie/rock & roll including an Aboriginal band, heavy rock & roll, and heavy metal. Two of the bands were "unearthed" by Triple J radio.

Band merchandise will be available for sale at the venue. The Kalbarri Sport & Recreation Committee will be operating a bar for the event within the Sport & Recreation Centre so the event is licenced and patrons cannot bring their own alcohol into the event area. There will be a few mobile food vans present.

Gaps in the oval fencing are hopefully going to be re-filled soon to try and stop kangaroos accessing the oval to feed, and the Shire would appreciate it if people would not take down or push through the fill-in fencing. The Shire has arranged to have the oval treated for ticks and ants prior to this event to reduce possible annoyance to attendees from these insects.

The event application received and approved by the Shire was for the event to commence at 2:00pm and finish at 10:00pm as it did in 2024. Jamart Sound Lounge has recently asked if the approved finish time for the event can be extended to 11:00pm. Council will consider this request at the February 2025 Council Meeting after seeking comments from nearby accommodation businesses which will be most impacted by the event.
